Comments:

- Due to COVID restrictions, from mid Mar to Aug Seeds closed the church to services, venue hire, café and playgroup; and during Apr-May 2020 the Nu4u Op Shops were also closed.
- We were eligible to receive Job Keeper for Apr-Sep 2020 due to our Apr 2020 drop in income. This along with the ATO Cash Flow Boost (a PAYG tax relief) and the SA State Government Grant, boosted our cash reserves.
- At the end of Mar 2020 our cash reserves were \$21,724. At the end of Jun 2020 were \$113,305.
- Employment costs above include Job Keeper top ups.
- The net COVID supports from the Government to Jun 2020 was \$85,628.
- Nu4u Op Shop expenses include some COVID rent relief negotiated with the landlords.
- The total building loan repayments (including principal amounts) are now reported as expenses rather than just the interest due to removing of loans from the Balance Sheet (now disclosed separately by way of note to the audited financial statements).
